Overview for School Staff: Your Guide to Summer Food Assistance

As a school staff member, what do I need to know about SUN Bucks?

SUN Bucks, also known as Summer EBT, is a program administered by the Kansas Department for Children and Families (DCF). This is a permanent federal program to help Kansas families buy food for their schoolaged children during the summer. Families will get a **one-time benefit of \$120 per year for each eligible child** to help buy groceries during the summer months.

SUN Bucks will serve students who qualify for free and reduced-price school meals or whose household income would meet the eligibility for free and reduced-price school meals. Some families will get benefits automatically without applying, while some eligible families need to apply to receive benefits.

Benefits are issued as a **single lump sum payment of \$120 per eligible child**. The benefit amount is subject to change each year in tandem with the USDA's Thrifty Food Plan. The amount will be announced in January of each year and can be found at <u>SUNBucks.dcf.ks.gov</u>.

Children can participate in SUN Bucks AND Summer Food Service Programs. We encourage families to use both of these great resources!

How will families know if they need to apply for SUN Bucks?

Households with an eligible child who can be identified by DCF will receive a letter from DCF in January 2025 notifying them that their child is eligible for SUN Bucks. These households will not need to apply. Beginning in April 2025, SUN Bucks benefits will be issued to an existing household Kansas Benefits Card (also known as an EBT card) or loaded onto a Kansas Benefits Card and mailed to their home.

Children in the custody of the DCF Secretary and enrolled in a Kansas school are eligible for SUN Bucks. Relatives, non-related kin and foster homes will need to submit a SUN Bucks application for children in their care **after April 1, 2025**, so the benefit can be issued to the correct address.

If a household did not receive a letter from DCF in January 2025 regarding SUN Bucks eligibility, they can apply through the DCF self-service portal at dcfapp.kees.ks.gov beginning Monday, Jan. 27, 2025. Applications for 2025 SUN Bucks must be submitted no later than Aug. 29, 2025, at 5 p.m. SUN Bucks benefits will be issued beginning in April 2025.

What are the key points for SUN Bucks 2025?

What is SUN Bucks?

- The goal of SUN Bucks is to ensure students have adequate access to food over the summer months.
- Children can participate in SUN Bucks AND Summer Food Service Programs. We encourage families to use both of these great resources!

Eligibility for SUN Bucks

- Some families will get benefits automatically without applying. Households with an eligible child who can be identified by DCF will receive a letter from DCF in January 2025 notifying them that their child is eligible. Benefits will be issued to a Kansas Benefits Card beginning in April 2025.
- Some eligible families need to apply to receive benefits. If a household did not receive a letter from DCF in January 2025 regarding SUN Bucks eligibility, they can apply through the DCF self-service portal at dcfapp.kees.ks.gov beginning Monday, Jan. 27, 2025. Applications for 2025 SUN Bucks must be submitted no later than Aug. 29, 2025, at 5 p.m. SUN Bucks benefits will be issued beginning in April 2025.
- Children in the custody of the DCF Secretary and enrolled in a Kansas school are eligible for SUN Bucks. Relatives, non-related kin and foster homes will need to submit a SUN Bucks application for children in their care after April 1, 2025, so the benefit can be issued to the correct address.

SUN Bucks Benefits

- SUN Bucks is a one-time benefit of \$120 per year for each eligible child to help purchase groceries during the summer months.
- SUN Bucks benefits will be issued to an existing household Kansas Benefits Card (also known as an EBT card) or loaded onto a Kansas Benefits Card and mailed to their home beginning in April 2025.
- SUN Bucks benefits can be used at any store that accepts SNAP EBT benefits. This includes farmers markets
 and other places that accept SNAP EBT. Benefits can also be used at some online retailers such as Walmart,
 Dillons, and Amazon.
- SUN Bucks benefits will be available for 122 days from the date they were issued to the Kansas Benefits Card. Unused SUN Bucks benefits will be removed from the card after 122 days. The date of issuance is the date on the Notice of Action letter the household receives from DCF when their benefits are approved.
